

With so much uncertainty in our world these days, it has been nice to see children running around being kids the way God intended. However, with the Covid-19 extension of summer, the full array of available activities has been exhausted. House parents and kids alike know it is time for a change of pace with the pending return to school.

We commonly hear about the abuse or neglect sustained by children before coming into foster care, but one form of neglect that can have a lifelong effect, if not corrected, is educational neglect. As a result, educational opportunities do not stop during the summer at Texas Boys Ranch.

Several years ago, a young man in the 4th grade was placed with us. We will call him Bobby. Bobby struggled in school and it quickly became evident why he was struggling. Despite being in the 4th grade, Bobby could not read. In fact, he could not even put the alphabet in the correct order. The school had little documentation of interventions due to the numerous moves prior to entering foster care and poor attendance.

Bobby's story is not uncommon for the children we serve. Many have attended two or more schools per year by the time they come to us and have had FAR from perfect attendance. We have had young ladies accompanying siblings to the elementary school by foot before walking to the Junior High school. Yet, despite the difficulties and lack of reinforcement from their parents, many of these children excel with a little encouragement and regular attendance.



For Bobby, he worked hard at school, stayed focused with homework helpers who volunteered, and concentrated with the tutor who had been organized to help him. In a few short months, he was easily able to arrange the alphabet and by the time he left the cottage, he said he loved reading.

So as summer ends, we are gearing up for school. School supplies are being collected. Children will go shopping for that special outfit for the first day and, before we know it, they will be excitedly waiting for the school bus.







The school bells will soon be ringing for the girls and boys of Texas Boys Ranch. It feels like just yesterday that the 2019-2020 school year started and here we find ourselves already about to begin another one. Who would have thought the last school year would have ended the way it did?

This is a busy time for our kiddos. Some are sad because summer is almost over. Most are excited about returning to school to see their old friends and make new ones- especially with the long absence because of quarantine. Many (even if the girls are the only ones who openly admit it) love shopping for school clothes and shoes. A lot of the youngsters at TBR have missed out on that positive back-to-school experience which most kids take for granted.

Take, for instance, thirteen-year-old Natasha. When she was taken shopping last year for school, she stood motionless in the department store aisle. Only her eyes moved, staring first at one backpack, then gazing at the other. She had narrowed her choices to these two. One was maroon and white, her new school's colors. The other was a deep blue, her long-time favorite hue. She shifted her weight from one leg to the other, shrugged her shoulders, and finally broke the silence by admitting, "I just don't know which one to pick".

When you consider school supplies, some new clothes, and a stylish haircut for each child to begin the year, you can see how quickly it all adds up.

She was excited, yet a little bit anxious. It is this way for many of the children at Texas Boys Ranch.

There are going to be challenges with going back to school for the 2020-2021 year, I think most people agree on that. I don't think anyone really knows what the year will be like with all the new precautions and protocols that will be in place. While it will be an exciting time, it will also assuredly be an anxious time for some.

As you may know, it is rather expensive to prepare even one child for a new school year! Texas Boys Ranch serves up to 48 girls and boys on a daily basis. Not to mention the 70 or more children who will be admitted into our Emergency Children's Shelter at some point during the school year. This adds up to tens of thousands of dollars every year.


