

ONE WEEK

As I sat in absolute terror, I thought back over the last few days and wondered how I got myself into this...

A few days earlier, I arrived at the campgrounds and excitedly grabbed my gear and went searching for my friends who were joining me for a week at a church camp near Norman, Oklahoma. This was my fourth year at camp, and from the very first year, it had become one of the most enjoyable weeks of my entire year.

My first year at camp I was 8 years old and scared. But my brother was going too, so my parents didn't give me any choice. I WAS GOING! Several friends from church were also there and it turned out to be an amazing experience. I not only had fun, but I began to really pay attention to the teachers and friends as they talked about God as if they knew him. I listened to kids not much older than me leading songs and prayers. I thought, "how can they get up in front of all these people and do that?" Then each morning, I listened to kids and teenagers preaching (short talks). How do they have the courage to do that? I could never "in my wildest dreams" do anything like that.

My second year at church camp was even more amazing than my first. My desire to learn more about Jesus had increased over the last year and I began reading the bible that I got as a Christmas present. Again, I witnessed kids my age standing in front of other kids and grownups praying, singing, and speaking. No way! I listened and envied my friends and others who

had the courage to do that. But, not me. Too shy! Stage fright! Fear of public Speaking! So, I kept this feeling that I refused to acknowledge tucked away for another year.

My third year at church camp was much the same as previous years...my most looked forward to week of my entire summer. This was the year I embraced Jesus as my savior and experienced the overwhelming realization that even 10-year old's need Jesus. And God adopted me as His son.

So here I am my fourth year at church camp and earlier in the week I signed up to give a 10-minute talk...in front of kids and grownups. I really don't remember a single point I made that day. The only thing I remember is being told that I did a good job when it was all over and stumbled off the stage with jelly legs and stumbled to my seat.

Some have asked why we want to send our kids to church camp every year. It is simple. For many of our children, it is their first time at church camp. For others, they (like me) can't wait for one of the most enjoyable weeks of their summer. This ONE week may make an eternal difference in the lives of these vulnerable children and youth who have experienced so much ugliness in their short lives.

I know it did for me!

We are able to provide experiences like these when our community commits to send our kids to camp and pray that the Lord will intercede in their hearts and minds to transform them into the young men and women He designed them to be.

CHURCH CAMP



Do you have fond memories of going to camp in the summertime? There's something about spending a week in the middle of God's natural creation that has an impact, not only on children, but on adults as well. Things like taking hikes on nature trails, using sticks and rocks to make a craft project, and listening to the sounds of all the creatures that are usually muffled by civilization, create a renewed appreciation for life away from the city.

What did you like most about church camp when you were young? Was it being in nature, singing, or some special moment that still brings a smile to your face whenever you think back on it?



One of my favorite church camp stories is about Alyssa. Alyssa was eleven at the time she first arrived at the Ranch. The house parents at the Ranch take the children to church every Sunday but when it came time for Alyssa to go to church for the first time, she adamantly refused. She told her house parents that she had heard nothing but bad things about church and she wasn't going and that was that as far as she was concerned. It just so happened that the following week was church camp time. After seeing how excited all the other children were about going to camp, Alyssa reluctantly decided to give it a try. That week at camp wound up changing Alyssa's life forever. I remember her excitement when she returned from camp. She couldn't wait to tell everyone about all the things she had done and learned, and about singing around the campfire, and about how church wasn't like she ever thought it would be. From then on, Alyssa had no problem going to church and since that time she has grown into one of the most beautiful Christian young women that I know.

Many of the girls and boys from Texas Boys Ranch return from a week at church camp mentioning the same things as Alyssa experienced. When I hear the excitement in their voices, memories of my own camp experiences often bring a smile to my face.

It costs around \$200 to send a child to church camp for a week. That seems like a very small price to change a child's life forever.

Our kiddos need to understand and appreciate the basic importance of faith in the Creator of the universe, hope in a better life (both now and for the future), and they need to experience love that is unconditional. A week at church camp helps instill and reinforce this foundation upon which they can build for the rest of their lives.

I highly recommend anyone working with youth or raising children to read this book so you can learn about the helpful tools available for the important discussions that all parents need to have. Baby Carrots and Old Vines

Spring is a magical time of year, and for many people it is their favorite season. There's an anticipation of warmer days to come when the daffodils and tulips put on their early color. There's a fresh sweetness in the morning air that is so delicious to breathe in. Garden centers see a rush on seeds and young plants as so many of us catch the fever to get back out into the sunshine and dig into the soil, eager to join in the process of coaxing new life to burst out after a long, cold winter.

We have spent recent weekends at my house preparing the garden beds, adding compost, building protective cages to keep the cats and dogs from digging in the freshly worked soil, and finally getting seeds in the ground. It's funny how after putting those tiny seeds in the soil, we want to see immediate results, isn't it? I'm ready to pull up a carrot and bite into that crunchy tuber and taste the earthy sweetness right now! I've got a saltshaker in my hand, anxious to pluck a fat, juicy tomato. Never mind the plant is only six inches tall! Still, I know it will be only a matter of weeks before we're able to enjoy the fruits.

And then there is that grape vine I planted last year. It recently started budding out as the days have

begun to warm, but it doesn't look too different than it did last summer when I put it in the ground. I certainly didn't get any fruit from it last year. I don't expect anything this year, either. I'll continue to tend to it, training it to grow the way I want it to go, giving it water when it's thirsty, fertilizing the soil to give it strength, and protecting it from pests that would try to destroy it. It may take several years of faithful, thoughtful attention, managing its growth before we begin to enjoy the produce. Even then, it will produce only a limited amount. But as it continues to grow over time, the benefits will become greater and greater! In fact, a well-tended vineyard planted today will produce for many decades, benefitting generations not even born yet.

There's a place for both the immediate and the slower producing plants, isn't there? One isn't better than the other. Each serves its own unique purpose in giving nourishment and healing to our lives. Your gifts to Texas Boys Ranch have an immediate, and needed, impact. Thank you for your generosity! Your gifts to Texas Boys Ranch Foundation are more like that vineyard. Planted today, they will be carefully tended, thoughtfully managed, and produce an ever-increasing harvest for generations yet to come. As you consider your charitable garden scape, please recognize there very well may be space for both. They don't have to compete with each other, but instead can be complementary.

If you have a heart for wounded children, let's work together to find the space to plant a beautiful vineyard that will produce an abundance of love and care for the abused, neglected, and abandoned. It may take time before we get to enjoy the full benefit of the seeds planted today. But then, won't it be worth it?
