At Texas Girls & Boys Ranch, we share Jesus every single day with the children we serve. From scheduled groups and activities to the daily devotions and prayer, we design our program to create opportunities for our staff to embody Christ at every point. We want to show our children how Jesus loves them even before we tell them. We want our daily actions to support our words. Some of the children we serve have not heard the word love much before they arrive here. Many others mistrust those who use the word because what they have experienced in their lives can be described in many ways but loved is not one of them.

Our consistent expression of love is the best way to help our kids understand what Christ Jesus has done for them. But when we want our kids to see the love of Jesus in a whole new way and to experience the broader scope of the Christian community that loves and supports them, we send them to church camp. Your \$250 commitment to send a child or teen to Church Camp is an investment that just might make an eternal difference!



Texas Girls & Boys Ranch is looking for compassionate, Christian families to provide foster care to children in need. In the state of Texas, there are approximately 30,000 children in the foster care system on any given day. As a result, there are not enough families to meet the demands of these children needing a temporary home. Can you help even one?



Have you ever considered becoming a foster or adoptive parent?

Most of the children in care have been removed from their homes due to abusive and/or neglectful circumstances. So we need people like you to provide safety, security, stability, and nurturance to these precious children. It's true, foster parenting or adopting a child can be challenging, but it is also extremely rewarding.

As a foster parent, you will provide the basic needs of a child such as food, clothing, and shelter, but you really will provide so much more. Great foster parents are open-minded, dependable, patient, flexible, and tolerant of change. You should be even-tempered, consistent with rules and structure, and have strong Christian principles.



While serving as a foster parent with Texas Girls & Boys Ranch, you will receive the training necessary to handle the emotional trauma these children have experienced. You will not be alone in this process. It is a group effort and you will be part of a team of people helping the child succeed. Fostering is a great way to get your feet wet if you are thinking of adoption.
