Ability to work with children from 3-18 years of age, including meeting their daily needs. Child's Daily Needs may include, but is not limited to: Cleaning and possible cooking/food-prep

Monitoring medical needs

Training is provided to assist in meeting the needs of children in care.
Pay is based on education and related experience.
